



MARATHON COUNTY DEPUTY SHERIFF'S BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION LAW ENFORCEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

The Marathon County Deputy Sheriff's Benevolent Association scholarship program exists to provide annual scholarships to youth who reside in Marathon County to further their education, to help develop their leadership skills and to support our community education efforts by recognizing scholastic achievement, under the provisions and conditions set forth below

1. The scholarship award shall be available to graduating seniors who are residents of Marathon County and who plan to attend a college/university or technical school. To be eligible the applicant must be accepted into an accredited Law Enforcement related major. Applicant must have at least a 3.0 grade point average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale. One \$500 scholarship will be awarded and additional scholarships of lesser amounts will be available and will be determined by available funds as authorized by the association.
2. To receive scholarship payment the recipient must enroll in any accredited college/university or technical school, and provide proof of admission to the Marathon County Deputy Sheriff's Benevolent Association Scholarship Committee or their designee.
3. If a recipient for this scholarship defaults in any given year by not attending college or technical school following high school graduation, the award amount shall be returned to Marathon County Deputy Sheriff's Benevolent Association.
4. Applicants must submit an essay of no more than 500 words addressing the following question: "How has your school experience prepared you for a career in the field of Law Enforcement?" The essay must be typed, double spaced, and in 12-pitch. The first and last name of the applicant must appear on the upper right corner of each page.
5. Three letters of recommendation are required.
6. The Marathon County Deputy Sheriff's Benevolent Association shall establish all scholarship criteria and determine who is to receive this scholarship. Criteria considered will include scholastic aptitude, academic performance, participation in school activities, service to the community, personal recommendations and other pertinent information from the student's application. Their decision is final and they reserve the right to change any or all aspects of this scholarship.
7. The deadline for this year's application is **March 27, 2020 at 4:00 P.M.**
